A special welcome of parents and students followed by a Special Assembly. Campus and Church Clean Up were conducted after lunch.




















Celebrating Your Students




Ash Wednesday

Principal's Pitch:



Ash Wednesday begins the Church's Holy Season of Lent. Lent is a forty day period in the Church's liturgical year that focuses on Repentance and Renewal. It is a time when the Church calls us to return to the Lord our God through almsgiving, fasting and prayer. The gospel reading for Ash Wednesday reminds us, we should not be the focus of our fasting, almsgiving and prayer – i.e. they are not primarily meant for public display or regconiton rather, they are meant to help us grow closer to God; the one who "sees in secret." As we journey through this Lent, let us truly look to God in all things, even in those things we do to help us draw closer to Him.


